RECOMMENDED ACTION: “that, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Board of Education approves the agreement between Sachem Central School District and Smithtown Central School District for Special Education Cross Contracted Tuition to students who reside outside the Sachem Central School District. Sachem CSD shall be entitled to bill the non-resident tuition rate as determined by the New York State Education Department. The term of this agreement shall be from July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.”

4.1.2. Approval of Special Education Cross Contracted Tuition Agreements 2015-16

4.1.5. Approval of Special Education Services Agreements 2014-15
