1. Begin by writing the following on the top left of the paper:

 - Period.
2. You may use, but are not limited to, the following method for outlining what you have read:

The Outlining Method

1. The information which is most general begins at the left with each more specific group of facts indented with spaces to the right.
2. The relationships between the different parts are carried out through indenting.
3. No numbers, letters, or Roman numerals are needed.
4. Use underlining for major concepts

Example .

Extrasensory perception

-Definition: means of perceiving without use of sense organs.

-three kinds .

-telepathy: sending messages

-clairvoyance: forecasting the future

- psychokinesis: perceiving events external to situation

-current status .

- no current research to support or refute

- few psychologists say impossible
