

## What to Expect as an Advanced Placement World History Student...

- **YOU MUST READ!!!** (approx. 2-3 chapters per month with accompanying assignments due each week)
- ***Generally***, 45-90 minutes per night should be spent on AP World 9 & 10 (different tasks require different amounts of time)
- Essay writing (level should be at a 4 or 5 now)
- Lots of **THESIS STATEMENTS**
- Analytical interpretation of documents
- Mature, collegial-level discussion (Debates, Inner-Outer Circle, Tutorials)
- Periodization!
- Comparative Analysis of Major historical events
- Analysis of Change and continuities over time
- “Big Picture” History
- Summer Assignment (geography/culture/”Big History”)
- College-level multiple choice questions
- 10<sup>th</sup> grade picks up where 9<sup>th</sup> leaves off
- Regents Exam in June, AP Exam in May (score of 3 or higher earns 3 future college credits, in most cases)
