ART CLUB (Ms. Allen)

Do you like to draw, paint, work with clay, or create sculpture? Then the art club is the club for you! Students have the opportunity to create projects outside of art class using various media.

BOOK CLUB (Mrs. Keith)

The purpose of this club is to promote a love of reading. Students will have the opportunity to read, discuss, and compare literature of their choosing.

BUDDIES CLUB (Ms. Austin)

Buddies club was created to promote socialization among students with special needs. It is open to all students. The club activities will include: board games, sports, gardening and other activities based on the interests of the members. Our club will also be participating in "Safe Halloween." Fliers will be sent out a week before each club meeting to inform students of the upcoming activity.

CHAMBER ORCHESTRA (Ms. Kant)

This is a select performing group that all Orchestra students are encouraged to audition for. The National Junior Honor Society is a national organization that recognizes outstanding middle school students.
