### Course Selection for 7th to 8th grade

Believe it or not we are presently at the halfway point for this academic year. In preparation for next year, your child's teachers are presently working with their Guidance Counselor in making course recommendations for their 8th grade year. Recommendations are made in the core subject areas of Math, Science, ELA, Social Studies and World Languages. These recommendations are made based upon grade point average, study habits, and work ethic.

Of course, students will also be taking Physical Education, Writing Workshop and Art and Music. Those students who are presently in Band, Orchestra and Chorus may choose to continue in those courses. Music selection is accomplished by signing onto Mr. Duffy's Google Classroom (code: rghasew) to make your music selection. If a student chooses not to continue in Band, Orchestra or Chorus, they will be placed in General Music. All students should sign into Mr. Duffy's Classroom to make their music selection.

### LIVESTREAMING BEGINS MONDAY, FEBRUARY 1

As our District has completed important technology upgrades, all classes will be livestreaming by February 1<sup>st</sup>. This means that on the days the students are at home, they will be expected to log into their Google Classroom and follow the class with the students who are present for the day. Every student must follow their schedule for the entire day using the AC/BD designation for that day. Students must attend ALL their classes, including electives, as if they were in school. Students who are part of the remote academy, ROSA, must log into their live streamed electives on Mondays and Fridays with their Seneca teachers. We encourage ROSA students to also participate in their elective live stream courses Tuesday - Thursday. Attendance will be taken for each class. Students will be marked late if they do not log in at the start of class, and they will be marked absent if they do not stay for the entire lesson. Any concerns about attendance must be addressed with your child's teacher. Any problems with accessing the necessary technologies - camera, microphone - should be addressed with your child's guidance counselor Administration. Our Board of Education has created Policy 4528 (https://go.boarddocs.com/ny/sachem/Board.nsf/Public#) acceptable and unacceptable practices during remote learning.
